### CAPE TOWN OUTREACH PROGRAMME

The Outreach Programme welcomes children and youth of all ages and levels of ability. The aim is to offer an enjoyable activity that introduces them to various styles of dance, and their many benefits. Among these are increased confidence, self-discipline and respect, physical development, an appreciation for healthy living and, of course, fun. Classes in Classical Ballet, African dance and Contemporary Dance are offered daily and takes place in school classrooms and community halls in the township areas of Delft, Nyanga, Khayelitsha, Kenilworth, Lansdowne & Philippi. These are some of the Cape's poorest, most crime-affected communities and areas that typically have limited extramural activities on offer. During school holidays, programmes and workshops are run at DFA (SA)'s premises in Athlone, and transport is provided. In addition to attending regular classes, DFA (SA) students enjoy a variety of performance opportunities.

### RURAL OUTREACH PROGRAMME

There are five Rural Outreach Programmes, which together reach more than 800 children.

*DFA Barrydale* - Dance training is given to children at four farm schools in the Tradouw Valley during school hours as part of the Arts & Culture curriculum. As well as classes for the village children. Transport is provided for the students participating in the senior classes, workshops & performances.

*DFA Paarl* - With minimal afternoon activities for youngsters in some of the impoverished rural areas of Paarl, DFA (SA) teaches dance classes at two primary schools, Klapmuts Primêr & Simondium Primêr through the Groot Drakenstein project in partnership with the Western Cape Department of Cultural Affairs & Sports.

*DFA Worcester* - Established in 2017 as another of DFA (SA)'s Rural Outreach Programmes, weekly dance classes are held at Worcester Gymnasium High School, with the possibility of extending the classes to primary schools in the area, in partnership with the Western Cape Education Department (WCED.)

*DFA Riversdale*- The DFA Riversdale programme commenced at the start of 2019 with a great number of very enthusiastic learners at three respective primary schools. These schools connect closely to that of Barrydale & will be part of future projects with the two regions combined.

*DFA Prince Albert* - DFA (SA) participated in hosting workshops funded by DCAS (Department of Cultural Affairs & Sports) in 2018, & recognising a great need for activities for the kids from the rural community & farm schools, started dance classes in partnership with PACT.

# THE DANCE FOR ALL (DFA) CENTRE

As its home base in Athlone on the Cape Flats, the DFA Centre has studios where classes are offered for children who are talented in dance and are committed to the demands of this art form. Students who are auditioned to join the academy, come from surrounding areas and DFA's Cape Town and Rural Outreach Programmes. They are integrated at appropriate levels - beginner, elementary, intermediate and advanced. Students frequently have the chance to work with a variety of experienced guest teachers and choreographers who are delighted to share their skills with the young dance stars of tomorrow.

# EXECUTIVE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR - ALLISON HENDRICKS


After what has been a very challenging year for everyone, having been unexpectedly affected by the global Covid-19 pandemic, the students returned to their classes very motivated after the national lockdown had been lifted slightly and, although some of our venues at the schools and those in the rural areas were affected, we were able to carry on our work as best possible, and all within strict Covid-19 compliance.

Our annual Artscape production and scheduled performances were unfortunately cancelled due to the pandemic, Covid-19 rules and regulations etc, and we decided instead to present an in-house performance Wistful in order to also assist our students & freelance part-time teachers who had been hit hard through the industry's huge financial drawback.

After the in-house performance, the full-time students went straight into preparations for their end of year assessments, presenting them with results of where they are technically and what work lies ahead for both students and teachers.

The students' commitment shows room for personal growth and technical improvement, working towards potential careers and opportunities.

Students on the Bridging & Teacher Training programme continue to grow in confidence and understanding the work of the organisation specifically and the connection of all, DFA's partnerships continue to be nurtured while doors for new partnerships are opened.

#### **Cape Town & Rural Outreach**

Programmes and class attendance were also affected with the dance classes times having to be adjusted to suit the restructured academic schools timetables and attendance, thus also affecting annual dance assessments and due to funding constraints during this difficult and trying time, we once again had to hold back on our annual Imibulelo showcase.

Student totals in the areas of Barrydale & Riversdale were encouraged by their teacher during the pandemic to stay motivated with continuing classes at home, at the best of their ability and with the little resources that they had.

The dance classes & schools in the rural areas were however put on hold by the schools' principals who had stopped all extramural activities in these areas, and DFA had offered to resume classes on a workshop basis to be able to accommodate the new time tables, totals in attendance and school academics

Classes in the Simondium & Klapmuts region of Paarl had resumed with new enthusiasm and resumed totals. We are hoping to grow this extra-mural activity in more areas of Paarl, and also Wellington in the year ahead.

#### **Teacher Training**

The trainee teachers, who are mostly in their third year, have been instrumental during this time with having to take on teaching classes where required. They continue to be mentored with theory as well as practical classes and online lectures in collaboration with our partner organisations. Theory work, projects & tasks especially played a big role during the national lockdown period.

#### **Dance for All InSPIRAtions Youth Company**

#### Objectives:

- To reveal, nurture and create opportunities for the wealth of talent and ability that exists
- To physically and mentally prepare students for a life as a professional dancer
- To provide dance training, individual guidance and assistance from experienced, professional teachers and choreographers.
- To create possible employment opportunities.

The company comprising of a small group of full-time students continue to benefit greatly through the opportunity to be part of InSPIRAtions Youth Company and becoming skilled in a variety of styles and more dance forms.

Performing existing and new choreographic works offered during this time an opportunity to be part of the smaller events and productions, from professional theatre productions to events & collaborations, that have taken place since the return after the national lockdown and closing of theatres.

#### **Partners & Collaborations**

#### Darkroom Contemporary:

One of DFA's partner organisations, invited our students to participate in their workshops, hosted at DFA by Darkroom Contemporary, through which they were able to join classes and the rehearsal process of what Darkroom Contemporary prepared for their productions.

Our students also received constructive online lectures by Darkroom Contemporary, in line with taking the students more in the direction of arts administration, social media, building personal profiles & bios etc.

Five of the full-time students were also invited to the Northern Cape by Darkroom Contemporary to partake in a film project

Our students were also part of a collaboration of students from Jazzart Dance Theatre, Waterfront Theatre School & LAMTA, for this years' televised KykNet Fiesta Awards

**Sizodanisa Productions** - our students were also invited to perform in the Ballet production Coppelia which took place at Artscape in April.


**Suidoosterfees** – an opportunity came for DFA to feature at the Opera House in the Extravaganza show during this year's Suidoosterfees Programme.

#### **Monitoring and Evaluation**

Monthly reports are submitted by the head of the programme covering students' progress; development planning; class registers, rehearsals, workshops, performances, student outings to performances, theatre visits and attending auditions.

Six monthly assessments are taken and an evaluation of the programme done re:

- **Project objectives** to ensure that objectives and required standards are met. If not, monitoring processes are changed.
- **Overall impact** a constant awareness of the impact of the project on students and finding ways of improving project delivery.
- *Financial control* monitoring of expenditure; review non-budgeted expenses i.e. additional student transport to attend classes, additional student meals.

#### 1. BASIS OF PREPARATION AND ACCOUNTING POLICY

The Annual Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with IFRS for SME's. They incorporate the following principal accounting policy which is consistent with that applied in the previous year:-

#### 1.1 Fixed Assets

The Fixed Assets of the Company are depreciated on the straight line basis based on the estimated useful life of the assets. The annual rate used for Computer Equipment is 33.33%. The annual rate used for Furniture, Fittings and Office Equipment and also for Motor Vehicles is 20%. Leasehold Improvements are depreciated at 5%.
